

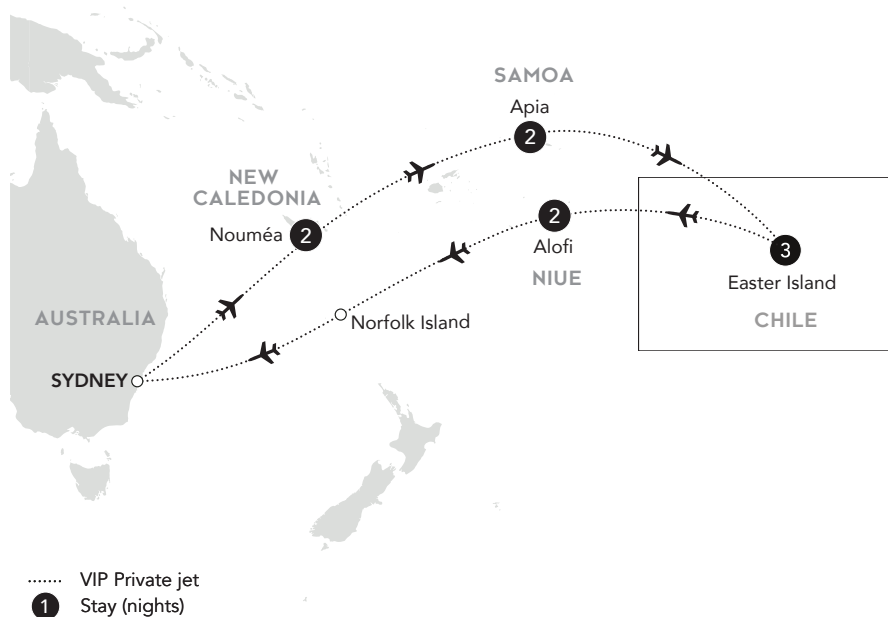
REMOTE ISLANDS OF THE SOUTH PACIFIC BY VIP PRIVATE JET

Celebrate Bastille Day in Nouméa. Discover the seldom-visited nation of Niue. Stand before the mysterious moai of Easter Island. And embrace the vibrant culture and lush landscapes of Samoa.

Sydney - Nouméa - Samoa - Easter Island - Alofi - Norfolk Island - Sydney

10 Days By VIP Private Jet

Day 1 Depart Sydney (Australia), Nouméa (New Caledonia)

Having met at our private VIP terminal, we board our jet for the flight to New Caledonia. Our French-inspired menu is complemented by fine wines, which we enjoy while crossing the South Pacific en route to Nouméa. The beachfront Le Domaine Nouméa offers us a glimpse of the paradise available across the island. This evening, we celebrate our arrival by participating in the lantern march from Port Moselle to Place des Cocotiers. Afterwards, keep watch for dolphins during our Welcome Dinner, as we dine directly over the water at Le Roof Restaurant.

Day 2 Nouméa

We begin our day attending the traditional Bastille Day parade. Lanterns adorned with the French tricolour overwhelm the streets, their owners' fervent and festive.

After lunch back at our luxurious hotel, enjoy a Your World experience:

- ★ Set yourself up for the rest of the day, enjoying a massage at our resort's Deep Nature Spa.
- ★ Alternatively, head out to see some of Nouméa's most striking scenery. Enjoy the area's breathtaking bays and beaches at close range and from several scenic lookouts.

Select from some of Nouméa's best restaurants this evening.

Day 3 Apia (Samoa)

Stepping aboard our private jet again, we continue our journey east, following a course for Samoa. Touching down on its second-largest island, Upolu, we make ourselves comfortable at Sheraton Samoa Aggie Grey's Hotel & Bungalows. Overlooking Apia Harbour, the welcoming resort serves as our base during our two days here. Relax and enjoy its amenities prior to dinner here this evening.

Day 4 Apia

Your World experiences are the order of the day:

- ★ Join a full-day orientation tour of Samoa. Explore the city of Apia, browsing the arts, crafts and produce of Fugalei Market. Get up close to the local marine life while snorkelling Palolo Deep Marine Reserve. On your way to Mulinu Peninsula, see the Mulivai Cathedral, whose striking architecture blends the Romanesque Revival style with traditional Samoan design elements. After witnessing the sacred burial grounds of Samoa's chiefly families, see the original Parliament House, as well as Independence Monument. Other notable site visits include the Robert Louis Stevenson Museum, the Bahá'í House of Worship, and the Pacific Jewell tropical gardens.
- ★ Head out on a morning sightseeing tour. Begin at the surreal To Sua Ocean Trench, a sunken swimming hole enveloped by a lush tropical garden. Access the water via steps and a ladder or simply take in the peaceful ocean surrounds from within one of the nearby *fales*, traditional thatched-roofed, open-air structures. Continue with a leisurely stroll through flourishing flora to the mesmerising Sopoaga Waterfalls at Lotofaga Village. Then enjoy an afternoon of leisure back at our hotel.

Our hotel hosts us for a Polynesian dinner this evening.

Day 5 Easter Island (Chile)

After breakfast, our private jet continues across the South Pacific Ocean, crossing the International Date Line on our way to Easter Island. The time difference between Samoa and Easter Island means our day is spent largely in the air. As such, we enjoy a gourmet lunch, as well as dinner, aboard our aircraft. On arrival, we check into Nayara Hangaroa, where we stay in Kainga (Earth) rooms.

Day 6 Easter Island

Rise early today for one of the world's most remarkable sunrises. Stand before the 15 moai statues at Ahu Tongariki as the sun's first rays appear. Light streams between each figure, while long shadows are cast behind them. This tiny island is unlike any place on Earth. The landscape is dotted with various volcanoes and lakes. The main draw, however, is the hundreds of giant moai, whose undeniable presence lends the island a sense of the supernatural. At Rano Raraku, we discover the volcanic crater once utilised as a quarry in the construction of the imposing figures. On Anakena's beach, we see the stretch of land where Polynesian settlers first arrived, having travelled across the sea in their dugout canoes.

A break for lunch gives us the opportunity to take in all that we have seen already today.

Your World experiences grant us further perspectives this afternoon:

- ★ Take in yet more moai sightings while paying a visit to Ahu Akivi. Here, seven of the giant statues stand in formation, facing the sunset.
- ★ Return to our lodge and enjoy a relaxing massage.
- ★ Depart on a bicycle and explore this rugged and magical island on your own schedule.

Tonight, enjoy local cuisine complemented with your choice of premium wine. Perhaps try the local Chilean variety.

Day 7 Easter Island

This morning, we head to the volcanic caldera known as Rano Kau. On one side, the 300-metre cliff affords dizzying views of the ocean. On the other, a gentle, grassy slope leads to a freshwater crater lake. In all directions, we sense with awe, the powerful forces of nature that have shaped this remarkable land.

Continue to Orongo Ceremonial Village, the site of the historical birdman challenge known as Tangata Manu. Each competitor would race down the sheer rock wall, away from the village, hurling themselves into the sea in a quest for the eggs of migrating birds, which nested along three islets a mile from shore. Upon his return to the village, the successful warrior would hand the egg to his tribal chief. As a reward, for the next year, the warrior would be known as Tangata Manu – the Birdman – and the living incarnation of Makemake, the chief god of Rapa Nui mythology. While here, we also look upon the village's many *Hare Keho*, traditional stone dwellings.

Not far from here, we see Ahu Vinapu, a ceremonial site that offers further evidence of Rapa Nui's exceptional stone architecture.

Day 8 Alofi (Niue)

Having more than satisfied our curiosity regarding this fascinating island, we return to the nearby airport to meet once more with our private jet for our gradual journey westward. We enjoy a gourmet lunch aboard our jet, before landing mid-afternoon on the island of Niue. See the sights of the capital, Alofi, then head to the Scenic Matavai Resort Niue, where we spend the next two nights. Our resort's expansive decks offer spectacular views across the Pacific. Relax and watch for spinner dolphins and Oceania humpback whales. Admire further views from your Clifftop Room before joining your fellow travellers for sunset drinks. Afterwards, a traditional Umu dinner is accompanied by a cultural show.

Day 9 Alofi

Your World experiences are the order of the day:

- ★ Absorb the local flavours during visits to a vanilla plantation and a hydroponic farm. At another plantation, try some coconut, pawpaw, and perhaps a couple of other seasonal surprises.
- ★ Make your way to some of the island's rugged shorelines to admire their remarkable geology and crystal-clear waters. Led by a local guide, get to know the region's flora and fauna, language and history.

After lunch back at our resort, a further choice of Your World experiences fills our afternoon:

- ★ Meet Mark Cross at his studio in Liku Village. Hear how he created the Hikulagi Sculpture Park, visit the museum and art gallery, and join a printing workshop. Learn the skills used in block printing and create your own piece of art to take home.
- ★ Get to know the local way of life during visits to several villages. In Lakepa, hear from our host about the area's history and culture, and try some freshly harvested coconut, pawpaw, and other seasonal treats.

Dine on the deck at our resort this evening, enjoying spectacular ocean views.

Day 10 Norfolk Island (Australia), Arrive Sydney

Rejoin our private jet for a flight to Norfolk Island, where a brief stop gives us the opportunity to enjoy lunch in this remote and historic destination. Our final flight returns us to Sydney. Reflect upon the remarkable time we have shared during our island journey as we disembark and say farewell.
