Adaptors and Electricity

Seabourn Pursuit features both US (110V AC, flat prongs) and European (220V AC, round prongs) power outlets. A limited number of adaptors are available on board. We recommend you bring your own. For safety reasons, hair irons and clothes irons cannot be used in staterooms. Hair dryers are provided in each stateroom.

In the Kimberley, our luxury Wilderness Lodges generate their own power. Each lodge can assist in charging items such as phones and cameras in the central dining areas. CPAP machines can be accommodated when advised at time of booking.

Beverages

Aboard your expedition or river cruise, a wide selection of alcoholic and non-alcoholic beverages is included at your discretion throughout the day.

Clothing

The dress code on our cruises and tours is relaxed. When packing, consider the time of year in which you are travelling and that it can potentially be quite cool at night, particularly on inland tours. We recommend layering your clothing so that you can be prepared for changes in weather conditions throughout the day. Sturdy footwear is essential, and wet shoes are highly recommended on some tours.

Health and Fitness

The nature of expedition cruising requires regular embarkation and disembarkation of Zodiacs for shore access, as well as wet landings on remote beaches, where footwear will get wet. Guests must be able to climb ramps and step in and out of smaller vessels. Walking frames are not permitted on any shore excursions. It is your responsibility to carry any medication (which may require a cooler bag). Consult your local medical practitioner for any health advice.

As Kimberley and Outback tours visit remote areas and feature activities with varying degrees of difficulty, it is vital to select a tour with an activity level suited to your health and fitness. A good level of fitness is essential for you to undertake walks in hot conditions and over terrain with uneven and slippery surfaces. Some walks will require you to clamber over boulders up to one-metre high. Detailed walk information is available upon request or booking.

Internet and Wi-Fi

Wi-Fi internet is included on board expedition cruise ships; however, connection is limited and not guaranteed. Mobile coverage is not available while the ship is sailing due to the remote locations.

In the Kimberley and parts of the Outback, mobile phone service is extremely limited. Wi-Fi internet is usually available at all our Kimberley Wilderness Lodges and may also be available at other resorts and hotels at a cost, but is not guaranteed. APT's 4WD vehicles all include Star Link Wi-Fi.

Laundry

Our expedition ships have laundry services (additional expense). In-room hand-washing can be done at each of our Kimberley Wilderness Lodges (however, washing is not encouraged at our Bungle Bungle Wilderness Lodge due to water conservation principles). In larger centres, hotels may feature coin-operated washing machines and dryers or they may offer laundry services (own expense).

Luggage

As a general rule, airlines permit passengers in economy class to take one piece of luggage that does not exceed 160cm (63 inches) or weigh more than 20kg (44 pounds).

PS Australian Star has a weight limit of 15kg (33 pounds). We advise you to contact your airline carrier or travel agent for specific information prior to departure, as size and weight limitations may vary. Each cruise guest is entitled to take one piece of luggage that does not exceed the above specifications.

On 4WD Tours, due to the size of 4WD vehicles and strict regulations for vehicle weight, there is limited luggage capacity. Please pack your required items into one small bag (not exceeding 66cm length x 35cm width x 32cm height, and weighing no more than 16kg. Hard suitcases are not permitted). Please enquire about our APT duffle bags. If you have excess luggage, please arrange for it to be stored at your hotel if returning to it post tour or organise for it to be forwarded to the tour's final destination at an additional expense.

Settlement of shipboard accounts is accepted via payment with Visa, MasterCard and American Express.

Passports

Kimberley cruise guests must have a valid passport with at least six months' validity from the return date of your tour. It is your responsibility to ensure these are obtained prior to departure.

Travel Insurance

Travel insurance is mandatory on all cruises and highly recommended on all land tours. Purchase comprehensive cover for any unforeseen circumstances that may arise on tour or before leaving home (this includes cover for any cancellation penalties, remote evacuation, medical and curtailment expenses, loss of luggage, etc.)

Visas

No visas are required for Australian and New Zealand passport holders.

Weather

May through to September is the best time to travel through the Outback as it is mostly winter time in Australia; however, it is the dry season for the tropical regions of Cape York, the Northern Territory and the Kimberley. In South Australia and Outback Queensland, temperatures are more moderate in winter.

For our Western Australia coastal and southwest tours, the best time to travel is from the beginning of March through to October.

The Kimberley region can be divided into two seasons — a wet season and a dry season. The dry season (May to October) can be mild to warm during the day, but can be very cold at night. From June to August, days are fine and warm with colder nights. Inland conditions at night can drop to below zero degrees Celsius and rainfall is rare.

Victoria and Tasmania experience their coldest months in June through to August.

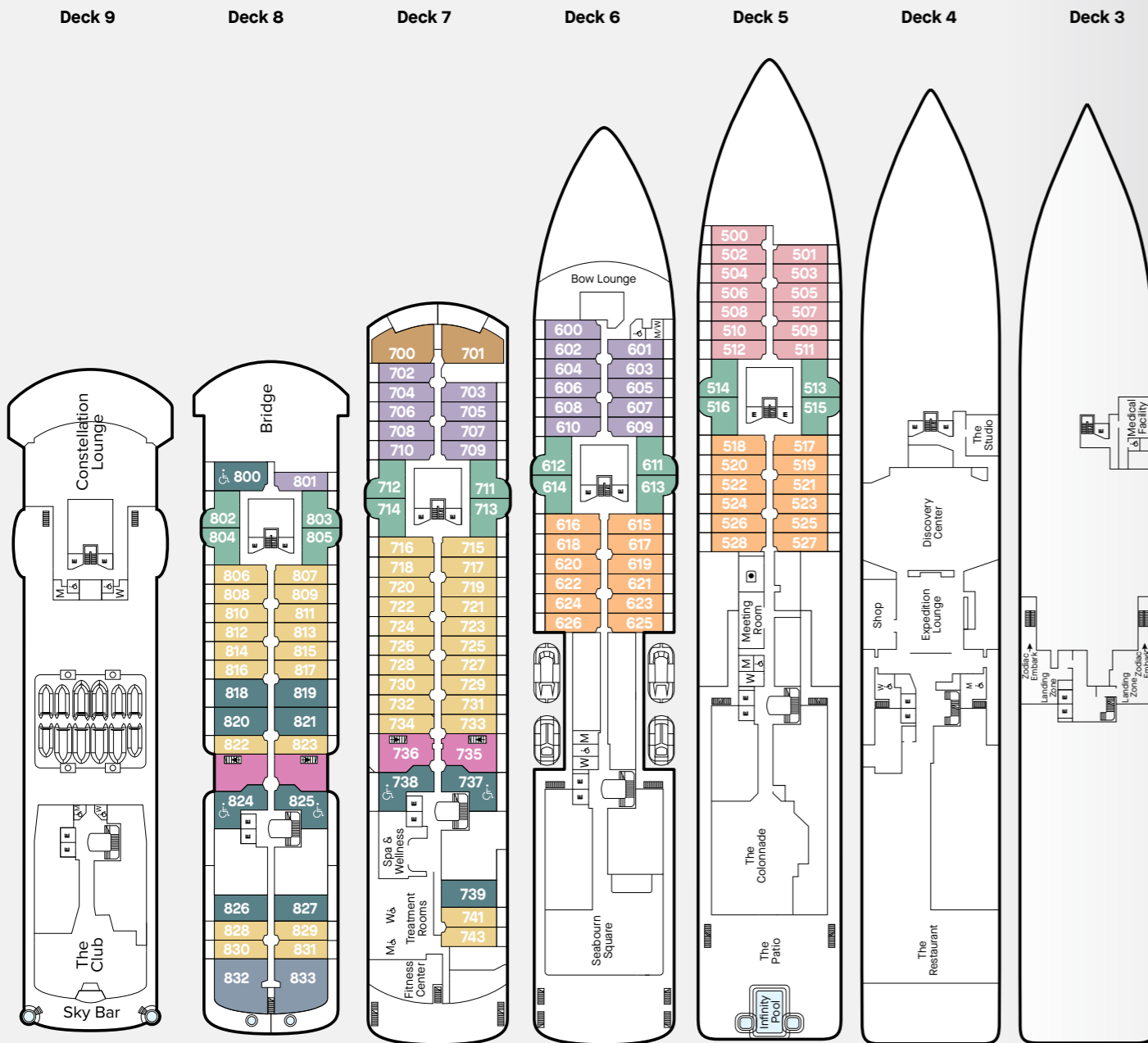

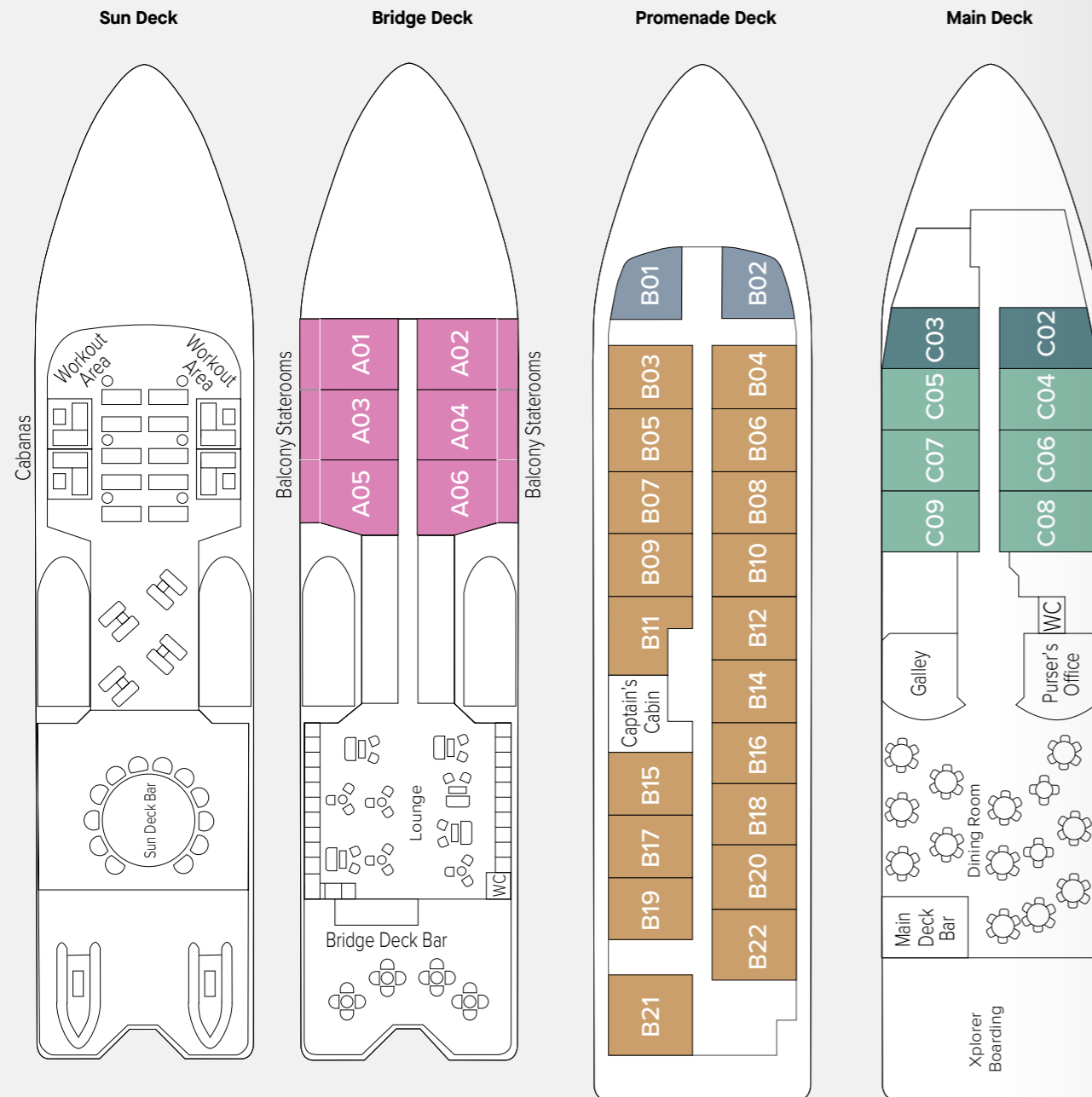

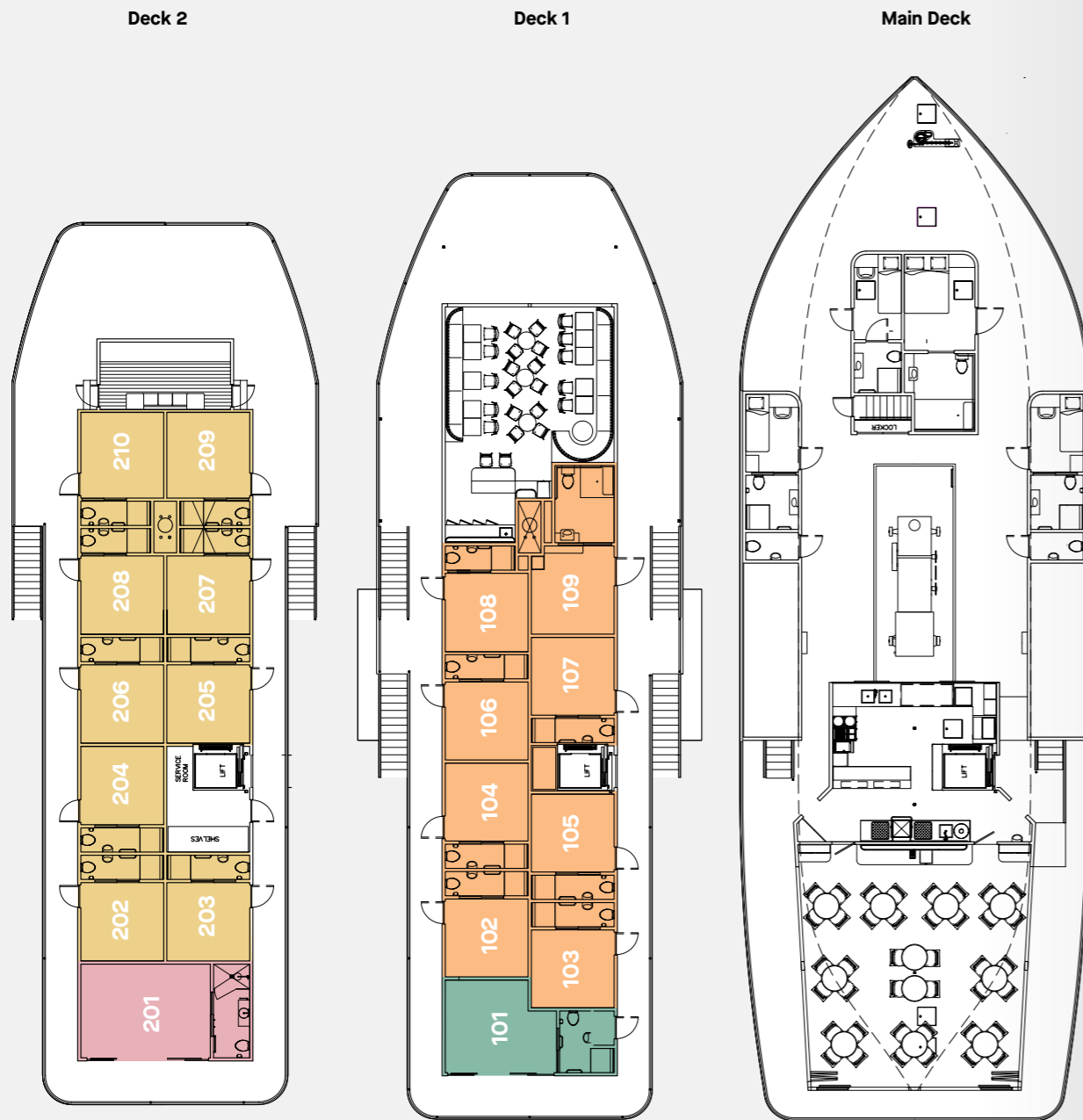

By asking us to confirm your booking, we are entitled to assume that you have read the full Terms and Conditions, that you agree to them, and that you agree that they apply to any arrangements that you book with us and which we agree to make.

Price Validity

Prices in this brochure were correct at time of publication but are subject to change. The most up-to-date pricing will be found on our website – www.aptouring.com. Prices will be confirmed at time of booking and honoured for up to seven days. All holidays are subject to availability at the time of booking.

Credit and Debit Card Surcharges

If you pay APT by credit or debit card, surcharges will apply. In the case of credit cards, a surcharge of between 1% and 3% (depending on the card used) is added to the tour price. In the case of debit cards, a charge of 0.7% is added to the tour price.

Travel Insurance

Travel insurance is not included in your holiday package. For peace of mind, we strongly recommend that you purchase appropriate fully comprehensive travel insurance suitable for your trip. For some destinations Travel Insurance is mandatory, please refer to the website for your destinations requirements.

Airfares

Air travel is arranged with independent airlines. APT will arrange air travel as advertised in connection with your holiday package. All airfares are subject to flight and class availability and will be booked on receipt of your deposit to avoid price or tax increases. Once air tickets are issued, amendment and cancellation fees and conditions apply and, in some cases, are non-refundable.

Transfers

Airport transfers are included on the first and last day of the holiday package and may be at designated times. They are not refundable if not used and cannot be re-routed. Other than the included transfer, all other transfers are at the travellers' own expense.

Freedom of Choice

Minimum and maximum group numbers apply on some Freedom of Choice tours. If your first choice is not available, you may be asked to choose an alternative.

Cancellation Policy

The following APT cancellation fees apply (in addition to charges of any independent suppliers e.g. airlines and hotels). Cancellation fees charged depending on days prior to departure may vary by destination. Please refer to our website for cancellation fees specific to your tour destination:

If you request changes after APT has issued your documents, APT may charge you an administration and processing fee of \$70 per person in addition to any applicable cancellation fees.

APT will not be liable for any direct or indirect costs that you incur as a result of any event or other factor beyond our control which necessitates a change in your itinerary.

Limitation of Liability

Our holiday packages include the services of independent providers, such as hoteliers, airlines, cruise companies and other operators, who are not agents or employees of APT. APT is not responsible for the conduct of the independent providers or their agents or for any ramifications of that conduct. APT accepts no responsibility for any death, injury, illness, loss, damage, detention, or delay beyond its control. Any term, condition or warranty expressed or implied by statute or otherwise in respect of the holiday packages contained in any of our collateral are excluded to the full extent permitted by law. Nothing in our terms and conditions excludes, restricts or modifies the application of the Competition and Consumer Act 2010 (Cth) as amended. To the full extent permitted by law, APT's liability arising under or in connection with these booking conditions: (a) is limited to the re-supply of the products or services or the payment of the cost of re-supply of the products or services to you; and (b) excludes liability for any indirect or consequential losses suffered by you or any third party, howsoever caused.

Force Majeure

Termination of Booking Contract or Change of Travel Arrangements Due to Force Majeure

If APT, in its reasonable opinion, considers that any Force Majeure event prevents APT (directly, or through its employees, contractors, subcontractors

and agents) from lawfully or safely providing any products or services subject of the booking contract with you, APT may immediately by written notice: (a) terminate the booking contract (in whole or in part); or (b) change your travel arrangements as reasonably practicable to ensure your safety and invoice you for any additional costs.

Limitation of Liability in the Case of Force Majeure

If APT cancels or changes your travel arrangements in any way due to a Force Majeure event, APT will not be liable to you in contract, tort, statute or restitution for any loss (including, but not limited to, loss of deposit or purchase price and loss of enjoyment), damage, costs, charges, expenses or injury resulting from or in connection with (whether directly or indirectly): (a) the cancellation or change to your travel arrangements; or (b) the Force Majeure event. APT is not liable to refund any part of the deposit or purchase price paid by you if APT subsequently changes or cancels your travel arrangements in connection with a Force Majeure event. As you are required to purchase travel insurance to adequately protect yourself against these risks, your policy needs to respond to these risks.

APT does not employ medical staff on its tours. If you require medical attention, local medical services can be contacted immediately. You are responsible for all medical fees.

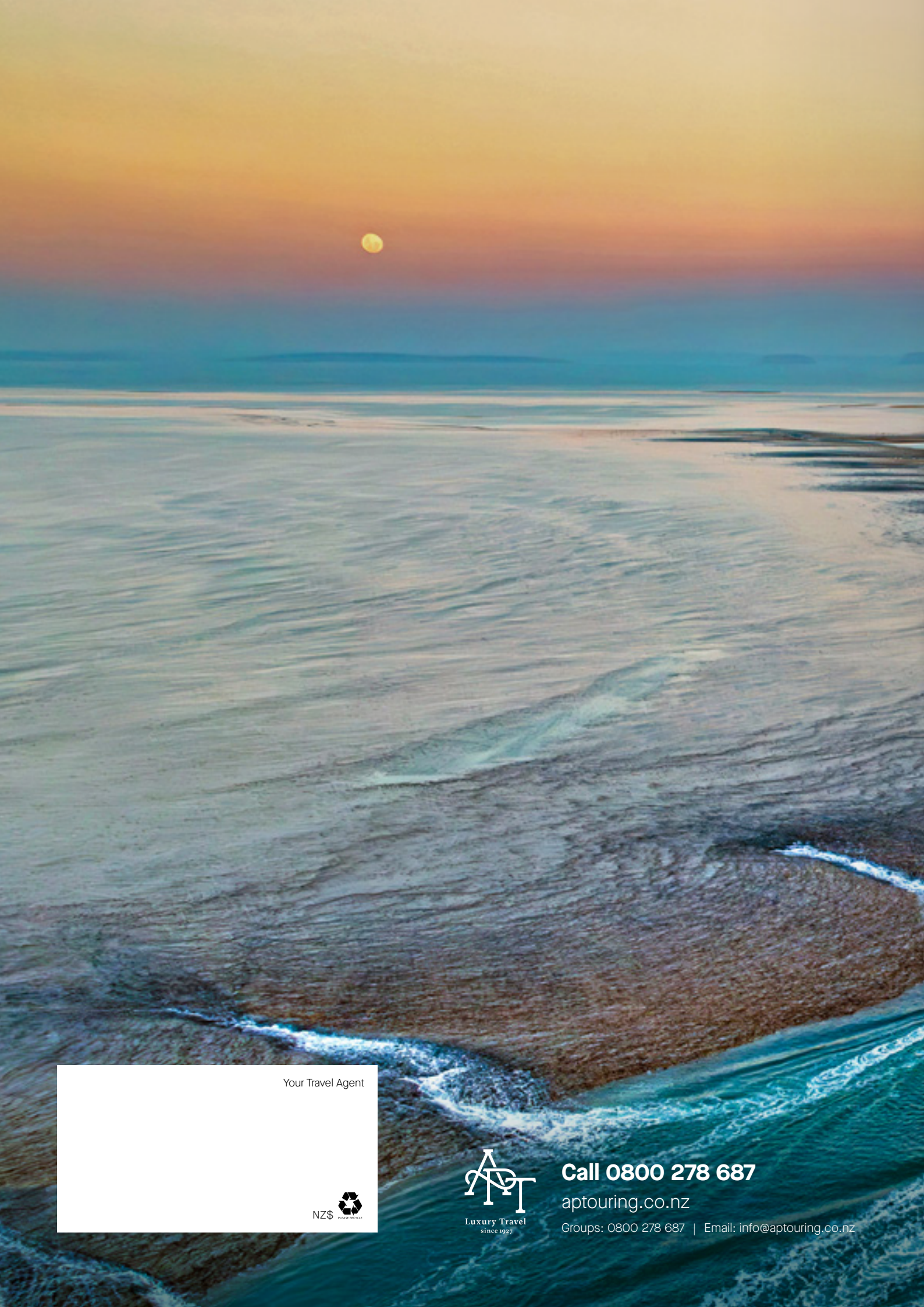
